

What Is Stephen Ministry?

Our congregation's Stephen Ministry equips lay people to provide confidential, one-to-one Christian care to individuals in our congregation and community who are experiencing difficulty in their lives.

Stephen Ministry Is *Your* Ministry

You play an important role in our Stephen Ministry. Here's what you can do:

- † Pray for God to bring hope and healing to hurting people through Stephen Minister during your time of need. God doesn't want you to bear your burdens alone.
- † Accept care from a Stephen Minister during your time of need. God doesn't want you to bear your burdens alone.
- † Tell a friend, neighbor, co-worker, or relative who is hurting about our Stephen Ministry.
- † If you are a good listener and a compassionate person, prayerfully consider becoming a Stephen Minister.

A Stephen Minister Is...

- † A child of God who walks beside a person who is hurting.
- † A congregation member with gifts for caregiving, who was carefully selected to serve in this role.
- † A commissioned lay person who has received 50 hours of training in providing emotional and spiritual care.
- † A caring Christian, who listens, prays, supports, and encourages.
- † Someone who will "be there" for his or her care receiver, meeting faithfully for about an hour each week, for as long as there is need.

Stephen Leaders Are...

Commissioned members of our congregation who have completed a week-long leadership training session equipping them to oversee and direct our Stephen Ministry.

Stephen Ministry Multiplies Ministry
